4. National Safeguarding Adults Week 21st – 27th November

This year <u>Safeguarding Adults Week 2022</u> will focus on the theme 'Responding to Contemporary Safeguarding Challenges'.

Safeguarding Adults Week is a time to raise awareness of important safeguarding issues. The <u>Ann Craft Trust</u> hope the week will enable more organisations and individuals to feel confident in recognising signs of abuse and neglect and recording and reporting safeguarding concerns.

In Cheshire East we have a number of events organised throughout the week, including <u>morning</u> and <u>afternoon</u> sessions on Monday 21st November with Odd Arts Theatre Group looking at exploitation and radicalisation, and a <u>Safeguarding and Faith Organisations Event</u> on Thursday 24th November.

5. White Ribbon Day

On White Ribbon Day, thousands of people stand up, speak out and say no to violence against women and this year Cheshire-based public service organisations are joining forces to host a free virtual conference to support the movement.

The conference will feature a variety of guest speakers – including the Cheshire Police, domestic abuse charity My CWA (Cheshire Without Abuse), UK-wide domestic violence charity SafeLives, members of the probation service and many more.

Attendees will have the opportunity to hear of ground-breaking new initiatives launched to tackle domestic abuse, see the unveiling of poetry and artwork created by domestic abuse survivors and be the first to watch brand new short films created for White Ribbon Day awareness campaigns.


7. Cheshire East Falls Prevention Group
